OVALS

Two out-laps Two fast laps Average determines qualifying time

Aeroscreen I the car's head top ring and visor that protects the drivers' heads from impact or debris

Part vs Full time | teams and drivers do not have to participate in the full season. Some only do ovals, the INDY500, or a small selection

Pit Stops | teams can have a max of 6 crew members 'over the wall' working on the car, refuelling is allowed

Push to Pass I temporarily increases horsepower and speed, can be used a set amount of time per race to pass or defend

Rolling start | after some warmup laps the race starts while running, in close formation, in their qualifying order until they cross the start line

Rookies I new drivers to the series get an R by their names

Spotters I team members placed at high vantage points to watch for traffic and help guide drivers

Spotters Guide | liveries can change week to week, depending on which sponsors a driver has, this guide helps to identify which driver is in which car
